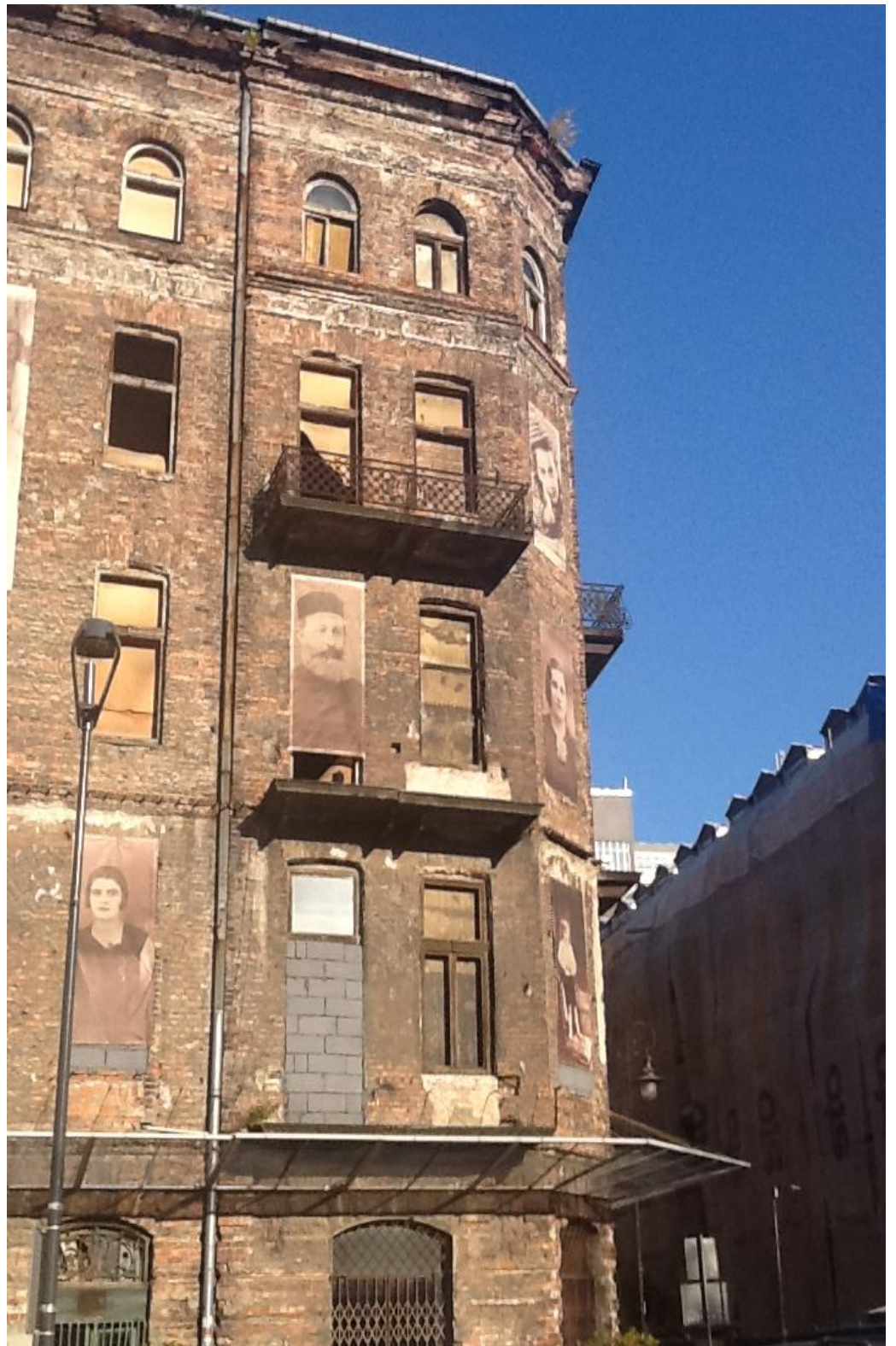
Additionally that, hatred towards German is reckless, we should not relive II World War times and we ought to remember that hatred may destroy us.
